RECORD OF TWO NEW LAC-HOSTS FROM MADHYA PRADESH

Mehra and Gokulpure (1967) have listed 44 lac hosts from Madhya Pradeh. The authors record here the following two more lac hosts for the first time from village Bamhani in Katangi Range of Balaghat Forest Division of Madhya Pradesh. They are also the first records from India (Roonwal et al., 1958; Varshney and Teotia, 1968).

(i) Ichnocarpus frutescens R. Br. (Dhimar bel) (Apocynaceae)

A climbing shrub distributed throughout India, Malaya and Australia. The phunki lac cells of Katki 1969 mixed with fresh settlement of Baisakhi 1969-70 through self inoculation were found on this shrub 18.2.70 while it was twining round the lac bearing palas (Butea monosperma (Lamk) Taub.) tree. The sexual differentiation in the settlement was very clear and the winged males vere observed on 2.3.70. Mathur and Singh (1960) have recorded Euploea core Cramer, E. coreta Godart (Lep: Danaidae), Fodina cuneigera Butler, F. stola Guenee (Lep: Noctuidae) and Margaronia bicolor Swains (Syn. Clyphodes bicolor Swains) (Lep: Pyralidae) feeding on this shrub.

(ii) Mucuna prurita Hook. (Kewanch) (Leguminosae: Papilionatae)

An annual with slender terete branches, cosmopolitan in tropics. It was collected on 15.2.70 with Baisakhi 1969-70 settlement through self-inoculation from the Katki 1969 crop received from the palas tree on which it was climbing. The winged males were observed on 2.3.70. Mathur and Singh (1960) have recorded Eugnathus alternans Faust. (Col: Curculionidae), Lithocolletis bascanaula Meyrick. (Lep: Gracilariidae), Bombotelia nugatrix Guenee, Calesia (Pasipeda) haemorrhoa Guenee, Haritalopha biparticolor Hampson, Lithosiopsis torsivena Hampson (Lep: Noctuidae) and Phalera procera Felder (Lep: Notodontidae) feeding on this climber.
